All peer-reviewed articles that arise, in whole or in part, from direct costs funded by the NIH, or from NIH staff, that are accepted for publication on or after April 7, 2008 must be deposited upon acceptance with PubMed Central. This condition of NIH funding is described in the NIH Guide for Grants and Contracts, NOT-OD-08-033 available at:

The Wellcome Trust, the Howard Hughes Medical Institute, and the UK Research Council also have deposit requirements for articles resulting from research funded by those organizations.

Effective with the January 2009 issue of *The Journal of Pharmacology and Experimental Therapeutics*, **ASPET will deposit on behalf of authors funded or employed by the NIH the final version of their article with PubMed Central** and make the article freely accessible at PubMed Central after 12 months. For authors funded by the Wellcome Trust, HHMI, and the UK Research Councils, ASPET will deposit the final version of their article with PubMed Central and make the article freely accessible there after 6 months.

ASPET will continue to make the manuscript version of articles freely accessible at the journal's web site as "Fast Forward" articles immediately upon acceptance for publication. The final version of all published articles will be freely accessible at the journal's site 12 months after publication in an issue.

As of May 25, 2008, NIH applications, proposals, and progress reports must include the PubMed Central reference number when citing an article that falls under the policy. This policy includes applications submitted to the NIH for the May 25, 2008 due date and subsequent due dates.

ASPET's publication policies meet the goals of these funding agencies. At the same time, the Society's policies will contribute to the continued viability of ASPET and its journals while providing free access to all research articles published in ASPET's journals.
